Forth Sunday after Pentecost: The Season After Pentecost is essentially the part of the year that is left over after everything has been accounted for. The name of this season varies widely from church to church—it can be called Kingdomtide, Dominion tide, or Ordinary Time. In most churches, the general theme of the Bible readings and sermons concerns the church's mission in the world. The Season After Pentecost began on June 9, 2025, the day after [Pentecost](#). In the eastern Church, it ends on November 14, the beginning of the Nativity Fast.

The main holy days during this season are as follows:

- **All Saints' Day**, The Sunday after Pentecost, the Christian Memorial Day on which all who died for their testimony of Jesus are remembered. *Eastern Christians celebrate Trinity Sunday on Pentecost.*
- **The Transfiguration**, August 6, the commemoration of the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ on Mount Tabor.
- **Dormition of the Theotokos**, August 15, commemoration of the repose of the Theotokos
- **Birth of the Theotokos** September 8th
- **Elevation of the Holy Cross**, 14, commemorates the discovery of the true cross in Palestine in the fourth century
